



# Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015 Principal Contractor and Contractor

## 1 Day Course

The pre-construction information requirements.

### **Session 4 Evaluation of Skills, Knowledge, Experience and Capability**

Evaluating skills, knowledge, experience and capability of the designers and contractors. Methods of pre-qualification. Reviewing the information supplied. Recording and communicating the information.

### **Session 5 Principal Contractor**

Review of the principal contractor's duties under the regulations.

### **Session 6 Construction Phase Plan**

Contents and use of the principal contractor's construction phase plan.

### **Session 7 Site Health and Safety Management**

Co-ordination of activities on site. Monitoring and enforcement of the site health and safety rules, procedures and arrangements. Information for the health and safety file.

### **Session 8 Health and Safety on Construction Sites**

Review of the requirements of CDM2015, Part 4, including site security, welfare, housekeeping, traffic management, emergency procedures, etc.

### **Session 9 Contractors**

Review of the contractors' duties under the regulations. Co-operation and co-ordination. Directives of the principal contractor. Monitoring performance. Construction phase plan, risk assessments and method statements.

### **Session 10 Examination**

Closed book examination.

### **Session 11 Course Review and Conclusion**

### **Upon completion of the course, delegates should be able to:**

- Understand the obligations placed on all persons involved by the CDM regulations;
- Understand the extent and benefits of effective risk assessments and method statements;
- Know the requirements for the construction phase plan and site health and safety management; and
- Understand the skills, knowledge, experience and capability requirements and how they can be verified.
